

Pattern name: Morrish's Pickpocket

Tyer's name: David Palmer

Hook: size 16 2x1 nymph hook

Thread: 8/0

Tail: 3-4 pheasant tail fibers

Abdomen: 2 different colors of BR sized Ultra wire

Back: goose biot to match one of the colors of wire

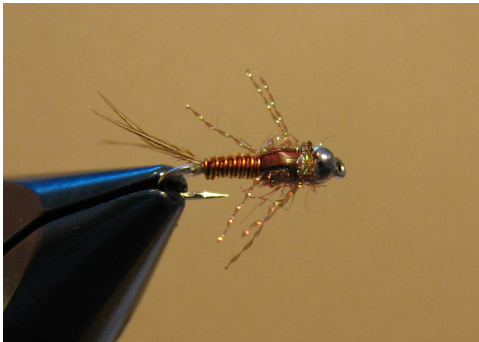
Thorax: Ice dubbing

Legs: Midge Flash

Wingcase: Same goose biot

Misc: gold, black or copper bead, .10 lead wire for smaller flies, .20 for larger

- 1: Place bead on hook
- 2: wrap 10-12 wraps of lead wire and secure behind bead with thread
- 3: Tie in pheasant tail fibers for tail
- 4: Tie in one of each of the two colored wires next to each other
- 5: Build slight taper with thread
- 6: Tie in goose biot tip with thick end off the back over the tail (and with curve of biot facing up)
- 7: Make three wraps holding both wires firmly and keep together
- 8: Unwrap one of the wires three wraps leaving the other wire wrapped
- 9: Pull goose biot over back and re-wrap unwrapped wire being sure to fill in the gaps left by unwrapping
- 10: Gently pull goose biot back, make two wraps forward with both wires together
- 11: Unwrap same wire as before two wraps, pull goose biot forward and re-wrap
- 12: Repeat with two wraps until wire reaches 55-60 % up the hook shank
- 13: Pull biot back, make one wrap forward with both wires, tie off with thread and clip
- 14: Tie in one strand of Midge Flash where wire stopped for rear legs
- 15: Dub thorax with Ice dubbing
- 16: Take two smaller strands of Midge Flash and tie on each side of fly to make two legs on each side
- 17: Pull biot over thorax, secure and wrap right behind bead, trim excess, whip finish and remove thread
- 18: Trim Midge Flash to approximately the length of the abdomen
